Capital Region Military Day at the Capitol

Albany, NY – Today at the Capitol, the Senate and Assembly recognized the important missions that the Capital Region military carry out in support of our national security, as well as the positive impact the military has on our communities, economy and quality of life. This day of appreciation is jointly sponsored by Senator Neil Breslin and Assembly Angelo Santabarbara.

Joining several members of the Capital Region military at the Capitol was the United Military Affairs Council (UMAC). UMAC, a program of the Capital Region Chamber seeks to highlight the importance of the military presence in the Capital Region and ensure its long-term viability and success. UMAC also strives to increase public knowledge of the contributions made by military units in the Capital Region, all of which impact the global, national, state and regional economy.

The military installations supported by UMAC that were recognized on Military Day include the 109th Airlift Wing, Stratton Air National Guard Base; the U. S. Army's Watervliet Arsenal; the Navy Reserve Center Schenectady; the New York Army National Guard Recruiting and Retention Battalion; and the Navy Officer Recruiting Station Albany, as well as other military units located within the Capital Region.
